PMT/PQP PARTNERSHIP

- Originated in response to inquiry from PQP 2002
- PMT participation from 113 trip members from at least 36 PMT churches
- Christ-centered and rooted in the Reformed Tradition
- Mutual prayer, hospitality, cooperative mission
- On-going programs:
 - Pastor-to-Pastor program in support of nonpaid PQP pastors
 - Basico (post-secondary education) scholarships
 - Hunger Relief during 2020/2021
 - Consideration of special requests: education, church expenses
- Nine Church partners in the PQP



ANNUAL VISITS/ MISSION TRIPS

- Involve clergy and laity commissioned by PMT
- Focused on building relationships between Presbyteries
- Blended--Q'eqchi and Angloworship services
- Partner in mission in Peten villages
- Theological education, programs for women, medical clinics, and church building projects
- Meeting with Pastors of the Peten Q'eqchi Presbytery

- 2006: Rev. Michael Davis realizes partner pastors receive no financial support from congregations and subsist on farm labor
- He organizes a "Pastor-to-Pastor" fund,
 recruiting PMT pastors to donate \$10-20 a
 month to support one PQP pastor.
- 2021: Eight PMT pastors now provide support for nine PQP pastors.

BASICO SCHOLARSHIPS



- Supporting 21 secondary education students
- School term runs from January – October.
- Churches nominate students and the PQP Executive Committee selects the number, which the GTF donation can support
- The need always exceeds the resources
- Has averaged + / \$300 each for 21 - 26 students = \$5,500 -\$8,200 / year

A FAVORITE MEMORY

- Talking (through a translator) to a group of women at Tamariz. The seven women included 2 or 3 generations, and they proudly told me they were from one family. It reminded me of my own sisters and brothers. I asked them about their lives: Did they live close to this church? (Some did, but one lived 2-hrs walk away.) Did they have a vegetable garden? (No, they bought vegetables from someone.)
- "I thought they would ask my age, or how my hair came to be white. But the only question they asked of me was to count to 100 in English. I did, in part. I told them the numbers in English were much like numbers in Spanish: 1-20 are simple; 11-19 are different/unique; and 20-100 are simple.
